In the mid-15th Century, Johannes Gutenberg from Mainz, Germany, introduced a more efficient way of printing - through letterpress. This exhibition will showcase a collection of types and presses from local traditional letterpress studio TYPESETTINGSG and also a series of print artefacts related to Singapore's letterpress and printing history.




